### How to apply for a visa

The visa department is open from Monday to Friday from 8.30 am to 11.30 am. The visa department is closed on local and Dutch public holidays. All visa applicants have to make an appointment by internet or telephone. Without an appointment you are unfortunately not able to introduce your visa request! It is advisable to apply in time (at least 2 weeks to 1 month in advance) in order to have your visa application processed. After your application has been registered the process takes at least 3 working days.  
Please note that you have to apply for a visa in person.

### Schengen Visas

The Schengen visa is valid for the following countries:

*Austria, Belgium, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Italy, Luxembourg, The Netherlands, Portugal, Spain, Sweden, Iceland and Norway, Estonia, Lithuania, Latvia, Poland, Czech Republic, Slovakia, Hungary, Slovenia and Malta*

A Schengen visa issued by an Embassy or Consulate of one of the Schengen countries allows the holder to travel freely in these countries. However, please note that a holder of a Schengen visa is still subject to immigration control and is *not guaranteed* entry into any of the Schengen countries; a visa is not in itself a right to enter a country. Please check the information sheet 'Traveling with a valid Schengen Visa' that you will receive while picking up your visa, very carefully!

### Where should I apply?

- If you intend to visit only one of the Schengen countries, you *must* apply for a visa at the Embassy or Consulate of that country.
- If you intend to visit several of the Schengen countries, you must apply for a visa at the Embassy or Consulate of the country in which your **main** destination will be, or, in case there is no main destination, the first Schengen country of entry.

### General requirements

#### General requirements + Identity

- a passport valid for at least three months longer than the validity of the visa, with at least two blank visa pages.
- one application form duly completed and signed by the applicant
- one passport size photograph in colour, with a light background
- handling fee for visa application (if applicable)

#### Means of support

- evidence of sufficient funds to cover the cost of your intended stay (e.g. traveller cheques, credit cards with credit limit statement, or bank statement).
- *(if the applicant has no financial means- a declaration from the inviting party who is covering the costs of the trip)*
- upon approval of the visa application, proof of travel insurance (including international health coverage) which is valid for all Schengen-countries has to be presented.

#### Proof accommodation

- Hotel reservation (or specification in invitation from inviting party – see purpose of journey)

#### Proof of intention to return

- a letter confirming the participation from your employer, organisation or institution (+Certificate on establishment of the civil society organisation), if self-employed, proof of registration of your company (+M1/M2 form)
- evidence of your onward journey (if you are travelling by airplane or bus a valid confirmed ticket reservation is required). After the visa has been approved the original ticket may be required.

#### Purpose of the journey (*facilitation*)

- Original letter of invitation of the inviting party

*Depending on the circumstance of your application, you may be required to produce further documentation.*
